# **Time to Celebrate**

## Purpose ·

Students will practice following one-step directions.

#### Materials-

For the teacher: chalk, chalkboard, The Secret Birthday Message by Eric Carle

For the students: copies of Black Line Master (BLM) Send Me Somewhere, markers, large paper

## Activity -

#### A. Pre-Activity Discussion

- 1. Discuss the importance of following directions.
- 2. Ask students to provide examples of times when they followed directions and times when it might be important to follow directions.

#### B. Read the Book

- 1. Present the book *The Secret Birthday Message* by Eric Carle.
- 2. Ask students if they have any idea what this book might be about. Tell them that it is about a boy who has to follow a secret birthday message to find his birthday present.
- 3. Read the book, and remember to remind students to keep in mind the steps the boy has to follow.

#### C. Recap the Events

- 1. Finish the book. Ask students to remember the list of directions the boy had to follow to find his birthday present. Record the steps on the chalkboard.
- 2. Ask for volunteers to retell the story using the steps on the chalkboard.

#### D. Apply What Students Have Learned

1. Pass out the BLM *Send Me Somewhere* and explain to students that they will be mapping out directions to send someone to a place in the classroom.

Some students will have difficulty choosing a place in the classroom. Assist them by suggesting a few easy to find areas in the classroom.



Use simple recipes to teach students about following directions.

#### **Teacher Directions-**
